Reading

This week we will read a historical fiction book with a strong theme about never giving up. We will discuss how a sequence of events can help characters learn important life lessons. On a side note, we have been reading several historical fiction books lately and the kids LOVE them! I highly recommend checking some out next time you are visiting the library! Our phonics skill for the week is words with the long-i sound (i, igh, ie). For vocabulary, we will learn about antonyms (hot/cold) and how we can use them to increase our understanding of a word's meaning.

Math

We will continue learning about telling time this week. The students have learned how to tell time to the 5 minute mark and we are working on telling time to the exact minute. We will also be working on concepts like "quarter 'till" and "half past," as well as A.M. and P.M. I love seeing the look of pride on their faces now that they have unlocked the secret to telling time! They feel so independent and grown-up because they no longer have to ask an adult for the time. writing

This week we will begin learning about opinion writing. After finishing this week's anchor story in reading, we will work together to write a book review. The students will learn how to share their opinion using the OREO cookie format- Opinion, Reason, Example, Opinion. I like this format because it forces the students to give specific examples that illustrate their reasons. We call this "showing instead of telling" and it makes the students' writing much more vivid and interesting.

science \$ social studies
