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Reading

This week is all about author's purpose. We will use the PIE acronym to help us remember the 3 main purposes: persuade, inform, or entertain. To help us compare and contrast these purposes, we will read 3 texts on the same topic (dogs). Each text, however, will have a different purpose. We will also use a graphic organizer to help us "zoom-in" on an informational text and prove what specifically the author wants to answer, explain, or describe.

For phonics, we will continue learning about the "magic e" at the end of words. We will also learn about the hard g (gap) and soft g (giant) sounds. For vocabulary, we will practice using context clues to determine the meaning of an unknown word.

writing

This week we will learn about our first part of speech: nouns! We will brainstorm examples and work on identifying the in sentences.

This week we will also learn about the format of a friendly letter. We will practice this skill by writing letters to our parents welcoming them to Open House.

Math

We beginning Chapter 2 in math this week. This chapter continues to focus on place value, but with larger numbers. We will begin by modeling how we can bundle 10 tens to make I hundred. This lays an important foundation for the concept of regrouping. Later in the week, we will work on writing 3-digit numbers in a variety of ways: standard form, expanded-form, base-10 models, and word form.

science \$

This week is Constitution Week. We will spend the week learning about this very important document and discuss what it means to our country. There is a fun Schoolhouse Rock! video (remember those?) about the Preamble that we will watch. The students LOVE the song and you can watch it for free on YouTube.

We are going back to the water cycle and experimenting with its involvement in in our daily weather patterns. This part of our weather unit includes a lot of tricky vocabulary, including evaporation, precipitation, and condensation.

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
