Reading

This week are focusing on using key details from the illustrations and words to help us answer questions with text evidence. Being able to cite text evidence is one of the major focuses of the Common Core State Standards, and something that we will continue to emphasis throughout the year. The students will learn how to state an answer and then "back it up" with text evidence sentence stems (According to the text...The author stated...On page __ it said...).

Our phonics skill will be consonant blends with *r*, *l*, *s* (<u>break, flip, stand</u>). For vocabulary, we will learn about root/base words and the suffixes –*ed* and –*ing*. We will learn how adding these endings changes the meaning of the word.

writing

We didn't quite make it to nouns last week, but that's okay because we are continuing to learn about them this week! After learning what a noun is, we will move on to distinguishing between singular and plural nouns. To make most nouns plural, we simply add an -sto the end. We will discover, though, that there are times when we must add -es(words that end in s, x, ch, or sh) or -ies (words that end in y), and that there are some even nouns that change completely ($mouse \rightarrow mice$)!

Math

The students are gaining a stronger understanding of place value and becoming more comfortable with some of the more difficult math vocabulary (value, digit, expanded form, standard form, etc.) This week we will continue to manipulate 3-digit numbers and break them down in different ways.

science \$

This week is Celebrate Freedom week and we are celebrating by learning about some of the important freedoms we have as American citizens, such as free speech, freedom of religion, and the right to vote.

We are wrapping up our weather unit in science this week with some cumulative activities about weather patterns, seasons, severe weather, and the water cycle.

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
