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Reading

In honor of the upcoming holiday, this week our reading will be devoted to learning about Martin Luther, King, Jr.! We will read a Scholastic News article to collect details about the different ways he worked to create change. We will also incorporate a new nonfiction text feature by learning how to locate important information on a timeline.

This week we will also learn about the different parts of a dictionary entry. We will discuss how each part helps us look up and determine the meaning of an unknown word.

Writing

We will be doing some informational writing using the information we collected about Martin Luther King, Jr. during our reading.

We will also continue working on using quotation marks in our writing.

Math

Last week was spent adding 3-digit numbers. We broke the concept down into small chunks so the students really mastered each step. I was so impressed with how easily the students transferred their knowledge from 2-digit addition over to 3-digit addition. This week we will work on subtracting 3-digit numbers, which is always more difficult, especially when you have to regroup twice. As usual, number stories will be incorporated with each skill and we are continuing to work on identifying and solving those

tricky 2-step problems!

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We will wrap up our unit on matter this week.

The students have loved learning about the different types of maps and navigating their way around using the various map elements. We will continue to explore different maps, and we will even take a close look at a map of Sea World to prepare for our field trip!

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
