Thursday, March 12-- 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Show (meet @ 6:10) - Book Fair Night One of our reading standards is to describe the connection between a series of historical events, so we will use our knowledge of cause-and-effect and sequencing to show how immigration in our country has changed over time. We will begin with the colonists from England and continue all the way through Ellis Island, and even today.

Reading

For phonics, we will begin learning about "the bossy r" and focus on ar words (star, yard). Our vocabulary skill will be shades of meaning. We will discuss the variation amongst synonyms and work on choosing the most precise meaning.

**writing** 

This week we will learn how and when to use commas, including in dates, places (city, date) and friendly letters.

Math

We will wrap up our unit on measuring length using the U.S. Customary System. We will continue comparing the different units and choosing the most appropriate tool for measuring specific objects (ruler vs yardstick vs measuring tape). The students have really enjoyed this hands-on unit and have developed a strong understanding of when/how to use the different units and tools. We will review on Thursday and take the test

on Friday.

science \$ social studies

This week we are beginning our big social studies unit on immigration. We will explore a neat website that gives firsthand accounts of immigrants arriving at Ellis Island. We will take a virtual tour of Ellis Island and walk through the check-in process. We will also analyze some immigration graphs and discuss the diversity of America's immigrants. Finally, we will compare the immigration experiences of the early immigrants to the experiences of today's immigrants.

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
