Reading/ Language Arts

We are once again integrating our reading and social studies units as we read about the Constitution in honor of Constitution Week. This week's reading standard involves "describing the connection between a series of historical events," so we will create a flow map to show the events that led to the creation of the Constitution. We will use sequencing and cause-and-effect vocabulary to link the big events together (*because...so...then*). For phonics, we will focus on consonant blends with r, l, s (break, flip, stand). In writing, we will be creating our own informational texts based on what we learned about the United States Constitution.

Math

This week will use "alligator math" (as I like to call it-Go Gators!) to explain the terms greater than less than and equal to, as well as the corresponding symbols. (>,<,=). The alligator always wants to eat the greater number, so we turn his mouth toward that number. We will also work on orderina 3-digit numbers. At home, try writing a few 3-digit numbers on index cards and have your child move the index cards around to place the numbers in order from least to greatest, or greatest to least. We will wrap up our unit with a review on Thursday and then test on Friday.

Science & Social Studies

In science, we will be classifying rocks based on different properties. We will also get our hands dirty looking at different soil samples!

In social studies, we will continue learning about the Constitution and The Bill of Rights.
