Reading/ Language Arts

This week we are switching back to fiction texts and focusing on making inferences. This implicit comprehension skill is one of the most difficult, but also one of the most important in order to really interact with a text. The students will learn the "equation" to create an inference (text evidence + schema = inference). We will learn that the illustrations can provide us with just as many valuable clues as the words. As we read, we still stop and add our schema to the text in order to think more deeply about the characters, setting, and plot.

Our phonics skill this week will be base words with -s and -es endings.

In writing we will work on creating compound sentences. We will join 2 shorter sentences together using words like "and," "but," "so," and "or." I call these words "cohesive ties" and we will experiment with different ways to "tie" sentences together and make our writing less choppy. I will also be stressing that these words come in the MIDDLE of a sentence. It can be so difficult to break the habit of beginning sentences with "and!"

Math

This week we will focus on word problems involving 2-digit addition. As with our previous unit, we will look for keywords and write equations to show our thinking. We will also learn how to add three 2-digit addends. On Thursday, we will review everything we've learned in preparation for Friday's test. Please make sure your child shows all his/her work on Thursday night's math review homework. It is so easy to make little computation mistakes, but students can earn half credit if I can see they used a strategy correctly.

Science & Social Studies

This week is election week! We will learn about why we vote and the process of voting. We will take part in a mockelection and see if our results match the rest of the country!
