## Reading/Language Arts

This week we are integrating reading and social studies by reading an informational text about the 7 continents. We will focus on using non-fiction text features (headings, photographs, captions, bold print, etc.) to help us efficiently locate important information within the text. Here are some text feature questions you can ask when reading nonfiction books at home:

- What are captions? How do they help you understand the pictures and words on this page?
- How do words in bold print relate to the pictures, the words, and the glossary?
- How does reading all the headings help you understand this text? How do they organize the text to make information easier to find?
- What is a glossary used for?
- · How do indexes help you get information?

Our phonics skill will be words with the long-i sound (i, igh, ie).

This week in writing we will continue learn about irregular past tense verbs. There are so many exceptions to the "add-ed" rule (give/gave, go/went, see/saw, run/ran, eat/ate, etc.)!
