## Reading/Language Arts

We are switching back to informational texts and will work on describing how an author uses reasons to support specific points in a text. This standard has two tricky parts: identifying key points throughout the text and then attaching reasons to those points. Here are some questions you can ask when reading informational texts at home:

- What are some key points the author wants us to know about this topic?
- How does the author make his or her points clear? Are there pictures that help support the points?
- What reasons does the author give to support these points?
- Does the author effectively describe or explain his or her reasons in support of the key points?

For phonics, we are focusing on multisyllabic words with prefixes(*re-, un-, over-, pre-, mis-*) and silent consonants (*knot, write, gnat, thumb*).

In writing, we will highlight the difference between adverbs and adjectives. We will look at several example sentences and determine which part of speech is being used. We will also work on expanding simple sentences by adding adverbs and/or adjectives. We will start with boring "vanilla ice cream" sentences and use adjectives and adverb "toppings" to create "sentence sundaes!"

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade show is this Thursday night at 6:30 in the cafeteria. Students will need to be dropped off in our classroom at 6:10 dressed in their Irish or Italian style outfits. This will give us time to add our special accessories and warm-up before heading to the stage.
