Reading/ Language Arts

We are continuing our informational research unit on rollercoasters and other Orlando attractions! We are finishing up our last text on rollercoasters and will begin collecting information from real theme park brochures later in the week. When reading aloud at home, here are some questions you can ask to discuss the organization and purpose of a non-fiction text :

- Is the author's purpose to describe people, events, and concepts; to give steps in a process; or to describe how to do something?
- How do the pictures, text features, and words work together to help you understand the main topic?
- When you "add up" the section headings, what do you learn? How do they build on one another to give you information about the main topic?

Our writing is being integrated through our research. Students will use the information they collect from the brochures to decide whether or not they would recommend that attraction to a friend. They will have to support their opinion in writing.

Math

We decided to push the start of our fractions unit to this week to have some more fun with solid figures and polygons!
